Mr. Ramon Gardenhire is the vice president of Policy & Advocacy for the AIDS Foundation of Chicago (AFC) and oversees AFC's advocacy and policy work at the federal, state and local level. He has been working in the health care related legislative and policy field for over 10 years. His areas of focus include the implementation of the Affordable Care Act and ensuring that new federal and state health care systems meet the needs of people living with and affected by HIV, Medicaid policy, state budget and appropriations, health care and HIV-related legislation and policy, and the Illinois AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP).

Dr. Lorece V. Edwards is a native Baltimorean. She is currently the Director of the Center for Sexual Health Advancement and Prevention Education (SHAPE) and an Associate Professor in the Department of Behavioral Health Sciences at Morgan State University's School of Community Health and Policy. Dr. Edwards received the Morgan State University School of Community Health and Policy distinguished alumna award in 2008. She was named Who's Who in Black Baltimore in 2010 and identified as one of Maryland's Top 100 Women.
